## - Kindergarten

- Students are learning about fire safety in preparation for our assembly on 10/23.
- They are learning the life cycle of apples and pumpkins and are eager to carve a pumpkin on Halloween.
- They are continuing to learn letter sounds and correct lowercase letter and number formation.
- They are learning to count numbers to 10 in a set, circular pattern and scattered arrangement.
- Kindergarteners are learning how to log onto their Chromebooks and use the District ST Math program with JiJi the Penguin.
- 1st Grade
- First graders are working hard learning addition strategies to add
- Students are also practicing reading strategies when decoding new words.
- We are exploring light and sound with a PLTW lesson where children will learn how sound travels by making cup phones.
- 2nd Grade
- Math: we are focusing on hundreds, tens and ones to 1000. Writing numbers in unit form, written form and expanded form
- ELA: beginning to gather information from non fiction texts to write a paragraph about bats and the fall season
- Science: PLTW- continue with States of matter and how things change by heating and cooling them.
- 3rd Grade

■ In 3rd grade they wrapped up our first class read aloud, The Storm.

- They learned about the main idea and are now applying it to different non-fiction texts that they are reading. Students wrote about the main idea about themselves!
- In math they are continuing to work on multiplication and division using tape diagrams. They are also starting to focus more on specific times table groups.
- In Social Studies, they finished up our continents, oceans and address units! They are now starting to learn about different landforms all around the world.
- Students enjoyed building their inclined planes, pulleys and levers in PLTW


## 4th Grade

- Fourth grade continues to stay busy in the month of October.
- Our classes have finished reading The Secret Garden and will be beginning our new novel Eagle Song this week!
- In PLTW, students continue their learning about the Earth. Students were able to conduct hands-on experiments to discover more about plate tectonics and the effects on our land.
- In social studies, the grade level launches their study of Native Americans this week focusing primarily on the Algonquian and Iroquois tribes.
- They are excited to be completing our place value unit for addition and subtraction in math and look forward to our next module of study, place value concepts for multiplication and division.

- Wrapping up Place Value Concepts for Multiplication and Division of Whole Numbers. Up Next: Addition and Subtraction with Fractions
