- Kindergarten-

■ Math: Answering "How Many" up to 5 and learning to draw shapes through songs and poems.

- Fundations: Orientation and lowercase letters t, b, f.
- PLTW: they will begin forces of motion - pushes and pulls.
- They are making new friends and building the classroom community, while reviewing school rules and expectations. They are also learning colors through reading Pete the Cat books.
- 1st Grade-
- First Grade has started their reading launch unit by learning how to be active listeners and take care of books. Students have enjoyed being introduced to classroom libraries.
- In math, they are focusing on counting and comparing sets of numbers to 10 using number paths, tally marks and number bonds.
- First graders will start the first P.L.T.W. unit where they will explore light and sound. Students will be introduced to the design process as a way of solving problems in this fun learning adventure.
- 2nd Grade-
- Through the ELA launch and our SS curriculum, second grade is starting the year reading, writing and discussing fabulous books about building "classroom families". The children are learning many rules and procedures as well.
- In math, they are organizing data by using graphs.
- They started the PLTW unit on Properties of Matter where the children have to solve the problem of keeping ice pops frozen without a freezer or cooler.


## - 3rd Grade-

- Third-grade students are currently reading The Storm, focusing on various points of view.
- In math, students are learning about arrays and how they relate to multiplication.

■ Students are excited to embark on our PLTW (Project Lead The Way) lessons, which will introduce them to the fascinating world of simple machines

## - 4th Grade-

- Fourth graders are off to an amazing start! They are excited to begin their study in ELA with their first novel The Secret Garden.
- In the area of Math, they are reviewing multiplication and place value strategies.
- In Social Studies and Science they began the new year with the study of the Earth and its landforms. Students are excited to learn about our very own state New York and all of its special features.
- Classes enjoyed celebrating Patriot Day and Constitution Day within their classrooms. They are looking forward to a wonderful year ahead!
- 5th Grade-
- In math, fifth graders are learning about place value concepts for multiplication and division with whole numbers.
- In social studies, they are learning about geography in the western hemisphere, physical maps, the United States, Canada and Latin America.
- In Project Lead the Way, 5th graders are learning about properties and reactions.
- Students will begin examining ways to organize information and materials for their school subjects in preparation for middle school.
- RISE-

■ RISE began the school year by transitioning into new routines and adjusting to their daily schedules.
■ They are currently working on their N2Y curriculum, focusing on government and the topic is "We have Rules and Laws".

- Students are enjoying our new sensory room. This week they will begin a variety of fall activities.


## Special Areas

## ART:

- Artists are cooperatively learning and have been introduced to the art room rules and continue to practice appropriate procedures and use of supplies.
- Kindergarten artists started to create their "A" is for Apple and Artist collage
- First grade artists have begun their "About Me" collages and are starting their self-portraits this week that are inspired by the artist, Frida Kahlo.
- Second grade artists have begun their scarecrow collages and practiced the elements of art.
- Third grade artists have begun to draw their fall pumpkin artworks.
- Fourth grade artists have begun to create their "Look Who's Back to School" owl collage artworks.
- Fifth grade artists have begun to create their fall haunted house collages with a painted background. They are reviewing and practicing the elements of art (color, form, line, shape, space, texture, unity and value) and the principles of design (balance, contrast, emphasis, movement, pattern and proportion).

- Fourth grade has begun their genre study unit.
